<u>Newfolden Impoundment</u> – WCA – The City of Newfolden to get out of the flood plain is looking at an impoundment. The location being looked at is on County Road 8, north of Newfolden. There are 20.3 wetland acres being affected. They will need to buy credits for every acre disturbed. Motion by Walton, seconded by Peterson to accept the WCA Notice of Decision as shown by the WCA Technical Evaluation Panel (TEP).

<u>Swift Coulee Project Update</u> – This is a flood reduction project with marginal land being taken out of production. This would involve a RIM perpetual easement. All involved have signed the paperwork except two landowners, in the Phase I area.

Equipment bids have been extended until May 15th.

<u>NRCS Report</u> – Waterworth informed on the following: seven new EQIP contracts and two new CSP contracts; the local work group met with partnership from the NRCS and SWCD.

<u>Tree Program</u> – The trees will be arriving the second week in May. To date, we have 107 customers with 13,000 trees on order.

<u>Drill</u> – The new drill should be here next week. Scheduled plantings include 900-950 acres.

Soil Health – A project to improve soil health with an incentive to pay \$20/acre not to exceed 100 cres is proposed. Eight applications were received. Reviewing the applications, some had non highly erodible land and some highly erodible land. Motion by Green, seconded by Larson to approve and fund the highly erodible land applications.
